Ascension Day is celebrated on May 25, 2017

44 He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Jesus, himself, gives us a huge clue, or command, to a second direction we should be focusing our attention – neighbors! Oh no! Here comes the word "Evangelism". Unfortunately this word does not bring exciting thoughts to our minds but wait, maybe we should find out the meaning to a part of this word – Evangel. This is a Greek word that means to give a message of good news. If that is the case then we are already doing this in our everyday life. I am, are you not also? Who doesn't like to be the bearer of good news; we are getting married, we are going to be grandparents, your fever has gone down, God bless you, and the list goes on.

The "Good News" that seems the hardest to share is what we have just been reminded of at Easter. This news is fully explained in the New Testament – the 'promise of forgiveness of sins and fellowship with God, backed up by the event of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.' From the following passages we are given wonderful snapshots of this good news:

Luke 2:11 A Savior – one who rescues us

Galatians 3:13 A Redeemer – removes the curse of the law

Mark 10:42-45 **Becomes a ransom** – gives his life to rescue others

II Corinthians 5:19 A Reconciler – brings relationships back together again

Luke 4:18-29 **Giver of liberty** – releasing us from bondage

On the Day of Ascension, Jesus spoke these words to his disciples – "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth", Acts 1:8. We have received the Holy Spirit in our baptism and are also called to continue our journey by sharing the Good News!
