We know that to be saved is nothing other than to be delivered from sin, death, and the devil. It means to enter into Christ's kingdom, and to live with Him forever."

Jesus worked tirelessly to expand his family. Our family can also be unlimited as we follow Jesus' numerous examples of looking for and caring for those around us who need grace, care, support and encouragement. To accomplish these acts, we have been filled with the Holy Spirit to guide us, and received instructions from His Word.

What we receive from reading the Word is multi-faceted but the bottom line is that God loves us and wants us to love others. Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" {Matthew 22: 37-38}.
